

Guidelines for current students wanting to follow the AY 2019-20 Catalog requirements

If students in catalog years prior to 2019-20 wish to follow the new catalog requirements they must satisfy both the rules indicated below.

It's likely that many Juniors/Seniors will not qualify for these rules if they have already taken their 3rd Science course (Rule 1). If they have already taken ENGL 502 but not the 3rd Science they can still follow the new rules since ENGL 502 is also included in the list of new professional electives (Rule 2).

Rule 1	2 Sciences both DLAB – 1 Biological, 1 Physical (PHYS, CHEM or ESCI) CS 758 Algorithms is a required course (offered both semester; students still need 4 more CS 7xxx electives 1 Programming, 1 Theory & 2 General)	3 Sciences all DLAB – 1 Sequence in Biological (BIOL 411, 412) or Physical (PHYS 407, 408 or CHEM 403, 404 or ESCI 402 and either ESCI 401 or 409)
Rule 2	ENGL 502 is NOT a required course. 2 Professional Electives must be taken (ENGL 502 is included in this list of professional electives) 1 Writing Intensive requirement must come from any Discovery course (FPA, HP, HUMA, SS or WC) or Professional Elective (currently ENGL 502 and several Math courses)	ENGL 502 is a required course, completes Writing Intensive requirement
